He's had a very long career in the environmental field, most recently as the Solid Waste Manager of the Lebanon NH Recycling Center and Landfill. Marc makes it a priority to make the highest and best use of all materials accepted at the recycling center, working with staff to achieve a balance between reuse of resources and conscientious landfilling to extend the precious landfill capacity. Marc has put a large focus on educating his residential community and local students by offering facility tours and hosting an informative website that includes a solid waste blog.

Many of you may have recently heard Marc speak on NH Public Radio discussing his "Refill not Landfill" Campaign which promotes reuse. This campaign has garnered 300 pledges since April!
